# Introduction

The OAPEN Foundation is dedicated to open access publishing of academic books. OAPEN works with publishers to build a quality-controlled collection of open access books, mainly in the area of humanities and social sciences, and provides services for publishers, libraries and research funders in the areas of dissemination, quality assurance and digital preservation.

OAPEN (Open Access Publishing in European Networks) was developed as a 30-month targeted project co-funded by the EU in its eContentplus-program. The goal of the project was to achieve a sustainable publication model for academic books in humanities and social sciences and to improve the visibility and usability of high quality academic research in Europe.



# **OAPEN Foundation**

OAPEN Foundation was initiated by the University of Amsterdam (UvA), the University of Leiden (UL), the University library of Utrecht University (UU), the Netherlands Academy of Sciences (KNAW), the National Library of the Netherlands (KB) and Amsterdam University Press (AUP). These institutes act as Participants in the foundation and have provided financial support. The Participants form a Council that meets once every year. The Council elects the members of the OAPEN Board from its circle. The OAPEN Board can appoint one person from outside the Council in the board. In addition, the Board can establish an Advisory Board.

# **Board and Participants**

# Funding

In the first three years, 1 April 2011 - 31 March 2014, OAPEN Foundation received funding from the Participants and from NWO. NWO provided a yearly subsidy to match the financial support from the Participants. The total funding from the Participants and NWO amounted to 240,000 euro yearly. Subsequently, the Participants and NWO provided an annual subsidy of in total 55,000 euro for two years. A growing part of OAPEN's income comes from services and projects.

## **Objectives**

The objectives of OAPEN Foundation as stated in the bylaws are:

- To stimulate open access publishing of academic books
- To further develop OAPEN as a platform for open access books
- To develop a sustainable business model for OAPEN



# Activities in 2017

# **OAPEN-ERC**

This project started in December 2015 and finished in December 2017. During the course of the project, the OAPEN website was extended with a special ERC section (<u>http://www.oapen.org/content/erc-deposit</u>). This section includes information about ERC requirements, information about the Deposit service and guidance about publishing open access monographs. The service for researchers is provided through an online deposit form. The OAPEN website also includes a general section for publishers introducing the Deposit service, with guidance about the service (<u>http://www.oapen.org/content/deposit-deposit-service-publishers</u>).

The output of the project, in terms of publications that were identified, is clarified in the table below.

## ERC: Funder compliancy list

In 2017, as part of the project, a section has been added to the OAPEN website with a list of publishers that comply with funder requirements (from ERC, Wellcome and FWF). OAPEN's goal is to inform researchers about compliant publishers, but also to encourage publishers to adjust their policies so that they become compatible with funders' requirements.

During the course of 2017, the list has been extended with a column with links to the green OA/self-archiving policy of publishers. In January 2018, there were 25 publishers on the list.

# KU Open Services

OAPEN partner Knowledge Unlatched (KU) has introduced 'Open Services', designed to help publishers achieve greater impact for their open access books. The new service is an additional offer for those OA titles that have not been financed through KU's traditional crowd funding model. The service aims to increase discoverability of OA titles by working with a range of leading hosting platforms, indexing databases, and archives. KU will provide quarterly usage reports to demonstrate the real impact of OA publications, and introduce measures to avoid double dipping. Eight publishers in the USA and Europe have already signed up for the service.


All books will become available through OAPEN, in addition to the existing KU funded titles.



# **OAPEN Library**

# Publishers and the collection

In 2017, 957 titles were added to the Library. The total number of titles in 2017 rose to 4298, and 1% of those titles are chapters. About 40% of the new titles have been added through the cooperation with Knowledge Unlatched. Furthermore, the partnership with the European Research Council, Austrian Science Fund FWF, Swiss Science Fund SNSF and the Wellcome Trust also led to new titles.



It is interesting to note that in the first two months of 2018, the collection grew with 289 new titles.

# New publisher members in 2017


In 2017 we welcomed a number of new publishers as members to OAPEN, both eminent traditional academic publishers and new OA initiatives: bu,press, Cappelen Damm Akademisk/NOASP (Nordic Open Access Scholarly Publishing), Carl Grossmann Verlag, Goodfellow Publishers, Heidelberg University Publishing (heiUP), Kriterium, Liverpool University Press, Open Book Publishers, Taylor & Francis, University of Huddersfield Press, and Wits University Press.

## Usage

Starting in 2013, a COUNTER compliant usage data service was set up in cooperation with IRUS-UK. IRUS-UK is a Jisc-funded repository and infrastructure service. COUNTER (Counting Online Usage of Networked Electronic Resources) is an international initiative serving librarians, publishers and intermediaries by setting standards that facilitate the recording and reporting of online usage statistics in a consistent, credible and compatible way.

In 2017, the OAPEN Library served 1,312,147 downloads.





# Milestone 5 million downloads

In November we reported that the OAPEN Library had reached the milestone of five million downloads, since the start of COUNTER compliant reporting in June 2013.



# **Directory of Open Access Books**

The Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB) is a discovery service for peer-reviewed books published under an open access license. DOAB provides a searchable index to the information about these books, with links to the full texts of the publications at the publisher's website or repository. The Directory of Open Access books was officially launched on 1 July 2013.

# Milestone 10.000 titles

In November DOAB reached the milestone of 10.000 titles. Achieving this milestone was in large part due to our partner OpenEdition, who has been very important for DOAB's growth in 2017. OpenEdition added around 40 new publishers from the OpenEdition Books collection to the directory, which resulted in over 2000 new OA books.

# De Gruyter sponsorship

In March we announced that De Gruyter decided to become a sponsor of DOAB. With this sponsorship, De Gruyter celebrates the launch of the De Gruyter Open Access Book Library on degruyter.com. The Open Access Book Library is intended to draw attention to the growing number – and growing importance – of open access books. Of the almost 900 titles in the Library, approximately half are De Gruyter titles. The other half is supplied by publishing partners, but available on degruyter.com. This makes De Gruyter the largest independent publisher of original content open access books in the humanities.

# Chapter level metadata & ONIX import

DOAB is taking part in a European Horizon 2020 project (HIRMEOS), to develop a certification service for OA book publishers. As part of this project, new features are being added to DOAB. It is now possible to distinguish between chapters and books. A chapter is clearly indicated at the publication's record. Also, funder information is now included in the metadata. Another important new feature of DOAB is the possibility for publishers to get their publications and metadata indexed in DOAB through ONIX XML import.

## Publishers and the collection


In 2017, 4592 new titles have been added to the Directory of Open Access Books. Furthermore, 82 new publishers have been added. At the end of 2017, the total number of titles listed in DOAB was 10290.

The first two months of 2018 saw an increase of 1104 new titles, with 14 new publishers added to DOAB.





The growth of titles in 2017 is predominantly caused by the autonomous growth of the DOAB service. While listings from the OAPEN Library contribute to the development, most titles are entered directly.




## DOAB as usage enhancer

The Directory is proving to be a successful aid to enhance the usage of the books in the OAPEN Library. Apart from referring readers to the OAPEN website, this effect can also be measured by looking at the average downloads. The books that have been listed in DOAB are downloaded 343 times per year on average, compared to 216 times per year for books which are not listed; a difference of 63%.



# **Open access dissemination**

Digital dissemination is a central part of OAPEN's services, based on metadata conversion and data exports for aggregators, intermediaries and libraries. OAPEN maintains daily data feeds in several formats to enable integration of the OAPEN collection into library catalogues. Furthermore, to ensure maximum dissemination, OAPEN works with a number of content aggregators and library suppliers, and enables integration in social media. The chart below shows the results. It depicts the sources of traffic to the OAPEN website. The role of social media is substantial; especially Facebook. Among the top referrers are the academic libraries and aggregators ExLibris; Serials Solutions (ProQuest) and EBSCO Discovery Service. Furthermore, the traffic from Knowledge Unlatched, Google Scholar and Wikipedia is growing. Also, the traffic from the Brazilian provider ibpad.com and unglue.it is noteworthy: a sign that OAPEN's reach is expanding beyond academia. Furthermore, the role of the Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB) is more than substantial.





# **Technical developments**

# OAPEN metadata feeds restructured

Chapters are becoming a more substantial part of the OAPEN Library's collection and we have updated our metadata feeds accordingly. All data feeds (ONIX, MARC XML, MARC21, Excel, CSV, TSV) now contain full metadata of books and also of chapters, including the corresponding books. The ONIX data feeds are compliant to the specifications of EDItEUR; the MARC data feeds are compliant to the specifications of Library of Congress. On 2 February 2017, the ONIX 3.0, MARC XML and MARC21 data feed were restructured and the ONIX 2.1 feed has been terminated. The Excel, CSV, and TSV data feed had been restructured previously.



# **New projects**

OAPEN is involved in several new projects, outlined below.

#### **OPERAS**

The OPERAS consortium developed two successful applications for Horizon 2020 projects. OAPEN is participating in both these projects, outlined below.

## HIRMEOS

The HIRMEOS project is in the process of developing a number of new services across five existing platforms for open access monographs, including the OAPEN Library. The services include identification, authentication and interoperability (DOI, ORCID, Fundref), enriching information and entity extraction (INRIA (N)ERD), the ability to annotate monographs, and a service to gather usage and alternative metrics. HIRMEOS also involves DOAB, to provide automated uploading, and to develop a certification system to document monograph peer review.

#### **OPERAS-D**

The OPERAS-D (Design) project addresses long-term requirements for the development of the OPERAS e-infrastructure and network. The project develops governance models, requirements for future services, and the network of partners participating in OPERAS across Europe. OPERAS-D also engages with key stakeholders inside and outside Europe for potential collaboration.

OPERAS is a consortium aiming to establish a distributed research infrastructure for open access publishing in the social sciences and humanities across Europe. OAPEN is one of the partners, member of the core group and coordinator for the Netherlands. The OPERAS Design Study is the first major outcome of the OPERAS-D project. The main part of the Design Study consists of a landscape of OPERAS field of activity, the technical mapping of the OPERAS consortium, a survey on users' needs concerning scholarly communication and academic publishing, and finally the governance and business models of the future infrastructure within the ESFRI framework. A central finding of the study is the fragmentation of scholarly publishing in the humanities and social sciences. This has inspired the OPERAS vision and mission of integration.

## OAPEN-CH

OAPEN is involved in an ongoing pilot project with the Swiss national research funder SNSF, to publish a range of OA books in collaboration with 12 publishers in Switzerland and neighbouring countries. In all, the pilot involved 53 OA books and 52 books published in a conventional manner, as a control group. The pilot was largely modelled after the OAPEN-NL pilot, aimed at learning about the effect of OA book publishing on usage, sales, and cost. The project will be finalised in 2018.



# Promoting OAPEN and raising awareness for open access monographs

# KE Landscape Study

Eelco Ferwerda was one of the principal investigators in a study commissioned by Knowledge Exchange, with support of FWF, CRIStin and Couperin. The study, conducted with Frances Pinter and Niels Stern, provides an extensive overview of OA monographs' policies, funding streams and publishing models in Austria, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, the Netherlands, Norway, and the United Kingdom. The study builds on 73 in-depth conversations, conducted across the eight different countries, resulting in the biggest landscape study on the conditions and potentials for OA books yet.

# **Book Fairs**

OAPEN visited the Book Fairs in London and Frankfurt. OAPEN shared a stand with OpenEdition in Frankfurt.

# Articles and reports

#### Report on Open Access and Monographs

Knowledge Exchange published the study on the status of OA books in eight European countries. The report was written by Frances Pinter, Niels Stern and Eelco Ferwerda.
